Research Assistant Position in Experimental and Behavioral Economics

The Chair of Economic Theory at FAU Erlangen-Nuremberg offers a Research Assistant position as of August 1, 2014 (or later).

The Chair focuses on research in experimental and behavioral economics as well as market design. Prof. Grimm is director of the Laboratory for Experimental Research Nuremberg (LERN) and coordinates various research projects in the area of energy market design as well as in the emerging fields project "Taxation, Social Norms, and Compliance: Lessons for Institution Design" at FAU Erlangen-Nuremberg. Doctoral researchers are encouraged to work in the above-mentioned fields. We offer intensive supervision within a large and interactive team, challenging research projects as well as the opportunity to participate in the Bavarian Graduate Program "Evidence Based Economics".

Applicants should have a qualified degree in economics or a comparable subject with fundamental knowledge in microeconomics (especially applied game theory and industrial economics). The ideal candidate has experience in experimental or empirical research and should have a strong quantitative background. Fluent English skills are required, German would be an asset.

Fields of responsibility may include participation in ongoing research and teaching, as well as participation in activities of one of the chair's projects with practice partners.

Salary corresponds to the German pay scale and depends on qualification (TV-L E13). Women are strongly encouraged to apply. Severely disabled applicants will be preferred when equally qualified.
